Enjoy the warm weather, and don't hesitate to say "Hi!"

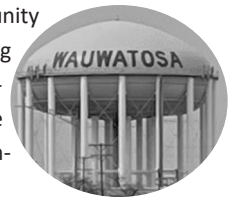

Events Around Town

FARMERS MARKETS

Tosa Farmers Market runs from June 4th through October 16th each Saturday morning from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. at 7720 Harwood Ave.

Every Saturday, this open-aired market will host roughly 45 farmers and food producers, selling a mix of produce, flowers, baked goods, cheese, coffee, waffles, popsicles, fish, meat and poultry, and prepared breakfast and dinner items. The first Saturday of each month, they add a Makers Market, featuring a selection of local artisans selling handmade arts and crafts.

Hartung Park Farmers Market kicks off June 22nd and runs through September 28th, available each Wednesday 3:30-7:00 p.m. The market can be found in Hartung Park. Parking is available on Menomonee River Parkway.

Zoo Interchange Project

On the north leg of the project, the I-41 North exit to Mayfair Road will remain closed until this fall. Also, I-41 North will remain as two lanes, between Swan Boulevard and North Avenue, until mid-June. The Watertown Plank Road entrance ramps to I-41 will also be closed during that time.

The project includes the construction of new bridges at Mayfair Road, North Avenue and Meinecke Avenue and a bridge for the Union Pacific Railroad.

Cribbage Tournament

After a two-year hiatus, teams representing different neighborhood associations are invited to compete in an all-city tournament playing this popular card/board game. Join us for the parade on North Avenue. The celebration is one of the largest parades in the state. Starting at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, July 4th, the parade proceeds west on North Avenue between 80th and 104th Street. Kids are welcome to sit along the curb as candy will be distributed from various parade participants.

Fireworks will be held later that night starting at 9:15 p.m. The fireworks will be launched from a different site (near 63rd and River Parkway) compared to previous years. The public is welcome to watch from Hart Park. For questions email John Hallanger at johnh1207@aol.com.

Wauwatosa School Referendum

The Wauwatosa School district will hold a host of ribbon-cutting ceremonies, as well as an open-house for its four new elementary schools starting in early June. All four schools (Lincoln Elementary, McKinley Elementary, Underwood Elementary and Wilson Elementary/WSTEM) welcomed back its students back in September 2020 and 2021. All four projects were became possible because of Tosa votes approving the 2018 referendum. The four events are listed here in order:

- Lincoln - June 2nd, 4:00 - 6:30 p.m.
- Underwood - June 3rd, 4:00 - 8:00 p.m.
- McKinley - June 4th, 10 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.
- Wilson and Wauwatosa STEM - June 8th, 5:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.

All four functions will be available to the public, and each one will host a variety of events following the ceremony depending on the school. The Wauwatosa School District Superintendent Dr. Demond Means, board members and principals will have some statements prepared for each ceremony.
